In the last newsletter, the EHHA Board addressed community speeding again, but we found that the cure could be much worse than the problem. We went overboard in explaining proposed homeowners' actions to make sure that each home owner was fully aware of this problem. However, we don't encourage standing in the middle of the road, or some such action, to slow down speeders. The Board has good intentions, but our authority is limited, as it should be. The EHHA By-Laws, initially approved in 1976, detail the purposes for which the association was organized.

According to Article II, they are as follows:

- To maintain and administer the program set forth in the English Hill Covenants and aid in protecting the Covenant from adverse conditions.
- To encourage a higher regard for the English Hills Subdivision.
- To keep members informed of any activities of zoning, planning, development, or legislation affecting English Hills.
- To encourage and effect social events.

The Board has been pressed into a legalistic role in the past two years, and clearly this is not the role that the Board should be taking. We are going to increase our efforts to encourage social events, which are necessary in bringing residents together.

What's Cooking? Chocolate Chip Apple Cake!

I thought since it's apple season, this Chocolate Chip Apple Cake seems perfect:

Ingredients:

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 1/2 cups white sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 1/2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg (or allspice)
- 3 cups apples - peeled, cored and finely diced
- 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Directions:

1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C). Grease and flour one 9 or 10 inch tube pan.

2. In a large bowl, cream the butter or margarine with the sugar. Beat in the eggs, then add the water and the vanilla.

3. Stir the flour, cocoa, baking soda, ground cinnamon, and ground nutmeg together. Beat this mixture into the creamed mixture. Stir in the chopped apples, semisweet chocolate chips, and nuts. Pour the batter into the prepared pan.

4. Bake at 325 degrees F (165 degrees C) for 1 hour, or until the cake tests done when a toothpick is inserted near the center. Transfer to a rack to cool. Makes about 16 servings.
