English Hills is really something special by Bill Geiger

My wife Karen and I arrived here in July 2007 to make English Hills our new home. It took approximately 9 months from the time we settled on our house here to finally pack up and move from Springfield, VA in the Washington, DC metro area to the ever-inviting mountains of Western North Carolina.

Our grand adventure into unknown territory was tempered by the fact that Karen's family has lived in this area since before the American Revolution, and her mother has lived here since the early 90's. Consequently we had made many visits here during that time and grew quite comfortable with the area. When we made the decision to escape the Washington area, our destination decision was easy....it would be Hendersonville, NC.

We knew how to get from Route 26 to Karen's mom's house on Crab Creek Road, but we knew little of the communities in-andabout the city. This was going to take some discussion with realtors, as well as an almost-daily scan of the various listings in the Hendersonville area. One community always stood out to me.... English Hills. Here was a community where the driveways weren't nosebleed height. In addition, the community was only mere minutes from downtown, and 7 minutes, give or take, from Karen's mom. This was too good to be true – and so good that houses rarely came up for sale.

Our luck changed dramatically on Labor Day weekend of 2006, while on our way to a visit with Karen's mom. We were on our way out Kanuga Road when we spotted the "For Sale By Owner" sign. Not being a couple to rush things, we waited until the next day to put a contract on our future humble abode.

To truly appreciate English Hills, you must come from a congested area where neighbors rarely socialize, and the focus of the homeowner's association is to see how many resident vehicles can be towed away, and in some cases from your own private parking space. I often referred to our Virginia HOA as a vigilante committee. They were impersonal and often insensitive to resident's requests.

Our English Hills Homeowner's Association is a group that focuses on the greater good of the community, as outlined in the covenants and by-laws. However, there is something very different about our community, because the HOA places a special emphasis on neighbor helping neighbor, and socializing is a major part of the effort.

There is a genuine effort made each and every year to bring the community together, but participation is often lacking, for whatever reason. Karen and I met many of our new neighbors by attending EHHA parties, and in the process have met some wonderful, gracious people.
